PHOENIX ACADEMY:

The Annapolis Neighborhood has been searching for a new, more personal, way to serve our community. In our quest, we have found a school for at-risk youth that provides quality educational and counseling services for about 150 children in grades K-12 in a small class and co-teaching setting. Approximately 75% of the families meet the income threshold to qualify for free and reduced cost meals. The students live all around Anne Arundel County and some even have an hour (or more!) bus ride to and from school.

Because of their wide population distribution and high levels of need, there is no PTA to support the staff and students. This is a great opportunity for us to donate school supplies and administer some TLC. We will have special collection for school supplies at our August Fraternity Meeting.

The school has many opportunities for our participation: supplying snacks for after school study sessions, tutoring children in a variety of subject areas, and a school-wide weekend backpack program. There is also a community food bank for which the Fraternity collected food at our June meeting; see the list of ongoing needs for the food pantry in the June PORTER.

During the coming year, we will be learning how the time and talents of our Fraternity can best be used to help the dedicated staff serve these children. I will bring you updates through the PORTER of our ongoing activities and volunteer opportunities. Please contact me if you have any questions. Denise Miante


