Dear Brothers and Sisters of Penance (Rule 7)

When you look at the cross and reflect on the Passion and Death (and Resurrection) of Christ what do you see? I see the LOVE of Jesus poured out on the cross for ME, for US and for all the world. Our Franciscan vision gives us eyes to see Christ suffering in the homeless on the streets in makeshift shelters, in the beggar on the corner, in the destruction of our planet when we see our streams and rivers and ocean dumping garbage on our shores and strangling our turtles and birds with fishnet and coke tabs, in the starving moms and children(men too) in Gaza etc etc and we cry out when will it STOP. When will there be Peace, Justice, Care for Creation and the Poor, the Sick, and the Marginalized?

Let us recommit to doing our part as so many of you are doing with your prayers, works of charity and justice and peace actions. But let us with new eyes look for more opportunities and share those with the fraternity on Saturday as we look to creating Our Fraternity Vision for the coming year.

DIANE DOUGLAS

Harry Thompson, first let us know that Dianne Douglas passed away at home in Lewes, Delaware, a few weeks ago (we do not know the exact date and we only learned today of the memorial Mass scheduled as shown below). Pat checked the web for obituaries since then and Monday, we saw her name in the St. Mary's/St. John Neumann bulletin and called St. Mary's this morning. Judith spoke to Dianne's sister Kathy this afternoon.

The memorial Mass for Dianne will be on Saturday, April 6 at 10:30 am at St Mary's (there will be a private interment and no reception).

On May 8, 1979, Dianne was the 43rd person to be permanently professed in the first decade of St. Conrad fraternity. Dianne served as the secretary/administrative assistant at St. Mary's Parish for many, many years. In October, 2011, she transferred to St. Clare fraternity in Delaware after she and her husband Jerry Barbacano moved there. Jerry died in 2023. Some of you may only remember Dianne if you met her at our fraternity 40th-and/or 50th-year celebrations in 2012 and 2022. The attached photo is at the 2012 event.

Housing Options:

Housing options will include single and double hotel-like rooms with private baths in the, **Christiane Inn** in close proximity to the dining room and meeting rooms. Accommodations are also available in cottages, downhill from the dining and meeting space. **Cottages** have two twin beds per room and shared baths down the hall. Map and more explanation of housing can be found on the regional website.

Event Costs:

All meals (Friday dinner through Sunday breakfast) and registration fees are included in the cost of the rooms. The lodging cost is based on the type of housing selected from the options below. There are no additional fees.

- Inn single room/1 queen bed for 1 person (\$265 by April 30/\$315 after May 1)
- Inn 2nd person in single room/1 queen bed for 2 persons (\$208 per person by April 30/\$235 per person after May 1) must designate roommate
- Inn double room/2 queen beds for 2 persons (\$225 per person by April 30/\$275 per person after May 1) roommate may be designated or assigned (\$200 per person by April 30/\$230 per person
- after May 1) must designate roommates
- \bullet Inn double room/2 queen beds for four persons (\$188 per person by April 30/\$210 per person after

• May 1) – must designate roommates Cottage – two twin beds per room for 2 persons (\$185 per person by April 30/\$235 per person after May 1) – roommate may be designated or assigned (**no single rooms in cottages**)

PLEASE NOTE: Single rooms are limited and available on a 1st come, 1st served basis. If you want a single room, or to reserve any other room of your choice, we encourage you to register and pay the \$150 deposit ASAP.

<u>Payment Options</u>: Payment can be made via check or credit card (subject to 3.5% fee).
